What is a Benefit Specialist:



These professionals listen to and advocate for individuals in understanding benefits and programs, assist with paperwork and applications for benefits and programs, collaborate to problem solve and determine which benefits and programs are available to the individual, and empower individuals with the best possible options.

What can a Benefit Specialist do for me:

Benefit assistance: helping older adults and adults with disabilities to understand Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security, FoodShare and other health insurance.

Disability Benefit Specialists: offer individualized discussions, providing information and answering questions from adults living with disabilities ages 18 to 59 years old.

Elder Benefit Specialists: offer individualized discussions, providing information and answering questions from older adults ages 60 years and over.

What are some of the questions Benefit Specialists answer:

- What kind of programs cover healthcare?
- Can I get help with the cost of my prescriptions?
- What kind of programs help with food costs?
- What kind of programs help with household expenses?
- Which programs best meet my needs?
- How do I apply for programs?
- How do I appeal when eligibility or coverage is denied?
- Can you advocate for me with other parties?
- Can you refer me to legal resources when necessary?
